

This will be a great opportunity to get all the new materials and information as the new Scouting year of program kicks off! As well as network with other Scouting leaders from various locations in our South Coast District.



Walk In My Shoes: Pack 105 Learns What It Takes



Tito Bautista, 39 is a graduate student at UCSB.

Unable to use his legs after contracting polio at age 2, Tito grew up using a wheelchair. But that didn't stop him from being naturally competitive. It was in the mid-80s when he was in high school, someone told him about the wheelchair basketball team. He made his way through a series of national tryout camps, he made the US national team and represented America at the 1992 Paralympics in Barcelona Spain.

Eric Kaiser is an architect in Santa Barbara. A competitive racer in his wheelchair, Kaiser says he got into coaching after meeting Bautista through the Riptides wheelchair basketball team. After suffering a spinal cord injury in a motorcycle accident in 1989, he turned to racing on the track and road as his primary sports interest. Kaiser who is 38, was a member of US Paralympic team in 2000, competing in the marathon in Sydney Australia.

At Pack 105's March Pack meeting, two outstanding local athletes came to dazzle the boys with their athletic prowess. Both Tito Bautista and Eric Kaiser over overcome their physical difficulties and adapted to life and sports in a wheelchair. The boys had a great time listening to Tito and Eric talk about their adventures as wheelchair athletes. Eric and Tito both exemplified the motto of "Do Your Best". Eric implied he had been in Scouting when he was younger. At the end, the boys engaged them in a little game of basketball.

Both Eric and Tito along with Dennis Nupdal, who is also in a wheelchair, spend each weekend and a week during the summer, coaching young athletes in wheelchairs to improve their skills in tennis, basketball, floor hockey, and other life skills.

- Who or what organization benefited from the project
- If the project included collecting items, record the number of items collected.

After entering the data, your unit will be eligible to receive the Good Turn for America patch and year segment, which can be purchased at your local Scout shop.

You can enter service projects throughout the year, so don't forget to come back and enter all your unit's service projects, no matter how big or small.

What you should know

- ♦ Monday through Thursday, your Cub Scout explores Crafts, Games, Nature, Archery, Science, Outdoor Cooking, Cub Scout Skills and more.
- ♦ Friday is a special day of non-stop fun. Parents are encouraged to join us at 3:30 pm for our Awards Ceremony.
- ♦ Adults who volunteer to help for the *entire* week will be given one free campership for their Cub Scout if registration is received by June 25th or we reach our maximum limit of 25 camperships, whichever comes first. We need your help...please volunteer! Many positions are available.
- ♦ FREE childcare is provided on-site for our volunteers' non-Scout aged children while helping at camp. Children must also be registered *prior* to camp to be eligible for childcare. Age appropriate activities help your kids to have fun, too!
- ♦ Transportation is **not** provided and is your responsibility. Please make your own arrangements. Carpooling is an ideal way to share the driving duty.
- ♦ All Cub Scouts must be signed in and signed out by an adult each day. This is a child-safety issue and must be adhered to.
- ♦ All campers must be picked up on time. The all-volunteer staff provides supervision only during camp hours.

What to bring to camp each day

- ◆ Sturdy closed-toe shoes (no sandals or thongs)
- ◆ A lightweight jacket or sweatshirt
- ◆ Sunscreen lotion and a hat
- ◆ Your lunch and a beverage
- ◆ A refillable water bottle

- ◆ A registration confirmation letter will be sent within 10 days of receipt of paid registration.
- ◆ Pre-registration is required. No walk-ins will be accepted at Camp.
- ◆ Registration will close at 4pm on Friday, July 16, 2004 or when 150 paid registrations are received, whichever comes first. A waiting list will then be established in the event of cancellations.

Pack Responsibility

- ◆ Did you know that Cub Scout Day Camp is staffed entirely by volunteers? In order to provide the quality of camp you expect and deserve for your child, we need your help.
- ◆ Packs must provide a minimum of one adult staff volunteer for each 5 Cubs attending. Submit volunteers' names on the space provided on the Camp Registration Form. Packs without an adequate number of adult volunteers may have their registration forms and payments returned.
- ◆ A one-hour training will be provided for all adult camp volunteers on July 15th. Youth Protection Training will be offered this evening also. Additional training will be offered for activity leaders to learn the skill they will be teaching. Volunteers will be notified of training dates in advance.
- ◆ To ensure your Cub's space at camp, please arrange for a volunteer from your Pack...how about you? If you volunteer to help at camp for the entire week, your son is guaranteed a space and will get to attend camp for free! (Payment still required to hold you son's spot at camp. Your check will be reimbursed at the end of camp.)

Receiving the *Pope Pius XII* Award for high school age Scouts and Venturers are Jonathon Swider, Troop 26, and Michael McClenathen, Troop 122. The seven recipients of the *Ad Altare Dei* Award include Daniel Helkey, Troop 1; Brian Ford, Troop 1; Zachary Swider, Troop 26; Patrick Burgess, Troop 105; Michael Schlesselmann, Troop 105; Sam Verhasselt, Troop 105; and Joe Yonke, Troop 105. The *Ad Altare Dei Award* is Scouting's first Religious Emblem Award which was awarded first to Scouts in Los Angeles in 1924.

Congratulations to Pack 105, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus Goleta Valley Council. They are one of two recipients in the Metropolitan Los Angeles Area of the *Pope Paul VI* Award. This Award is presented to a Catholic Unit that fosters growth of Scouting and the Church through a series of qualitative and quantitative achievements during a calendar year. Improved Webelos Transition

The passage from Cub Scout pack to Boy Scout Troop should be smooth, with no time lost in between. By the time Webelos Scouts are ready to cross over, they and their families should be familiar and comfortable with the boys and adult leaders of troop, their role in the troop and troop activities, and feel excited about beginning their new adventure. The Webelos Scout's graduation ceremony should clearly signify his transition to a new level of Scouting, and could include the presentation of his Arrow of Light Award, a Boy Scout Handbook, and a troop neckerchief.

The key factor to improved Webelos transition is the ongoing working relationship of the leaders of a Cub Scout pack and a Boy Scout troop. These leaders should work together to help move Webelos Scouts into a Boy Scout troop the same way schools move students from elementary school to junior high school.

Boy Scout troops should arrange for Webelos dens to visit a troop meeting with their parents to learn more of how a troop operates, what activities are scheduled, their advancement program, troop camping, summer camp, and personal equipment. A Scoutmaster should have a conference with both the boy and his parents so that the family can become familiar with the troop.

Finally, the Cubmaster and Scoutmaster should work together in planning a meaningful crossover ceremony at the pack's bridging and Arrow of Light Award meeting. Members of the Order of the Arrow may assist in this ceremony.

All Cub Scouts should have the opportunity to enjoy the advantages of the Boy Scout program and all the outdoor activities of the summer.
